


Basic Ticket Policies

- Reservations may be made by calling or visiting our Box Office.
 We accept VISA, MasterCard, Discover and American Express.
 Online sales are available via our website for an additional charge, which allows the purchaser to print their own tickets.
- Please arrive at the theatre no less than 15 minutes before the performance. To cause the least amount of disruption to the performance, the live performers and to other patrons, late comers will be seated at the discretion of the house manager. Late comers may not be seated in their assigned seats until intermission or at an appropriate break in the performance. Seating is available in the rear of the theatre for latecomers. This seating is also available for latecomers from intermission.
- Single tickets are nonrefundable. For an additional fee, single ticket purchasers may make exchanges for a different performance of the same production, given at least 24 hours notice before the original ticketed performance. Subscribers, including Flex Pass purchasers, enjoy free ticket exchanges.
- Discounts are offered for groups of 10 or more.

- CRT offers a wide range of discounts for "40 Belows", members of the military, and educators. See our website for more info.
- CRT reserves the right to refuse admittance to very young children to mainstage shows.

Basic Pavilion Theatre Policies

- Restrooms are located on the first floor of the Pavilion.
- Smoking and vaping are strictly prohibited inside both floors of the Pavilion. Smoking and vaping are only allowed outside and at least 10 feet away from the building.
- The use of recording equipment and the taking of photographs or videos during performances is strictly forbidden by law. Phones and/or equipment will be confiscated by the house manager and returned at the end of the show. Any photos taken or material taped will be erased.
- For the hearing impaired, a listening system is available at the box office. The use of this device is free of charge by leaving a form of ID at the Box Office.

Since joining the CRT Guild in 2000, Martha Howlett has consistently set the gold standard for volunteerism. Her unwavering commitment and remarkable contributions have made her an irreplaceable part of our community.

In her early years with the Guild—and for many summers thereafter—Martha took on the monumental task of managing CRT's summer refreshment counters. From stocking snacks and beverages to coordinating an endless supply of cookies from Linani's Catering with Randy Lewis, Martha ran the operation like a well-oiled machine. If that sounds easy—it's not. If it sounds challenging—you have no idea. Yet she handled it all with grace and efficiency, year after year.

Martha's impact doesn't stop at snacks and sweets. She proposed a lasting legacy: that the Guild donate 10% of its proceeds each fiscal year to the CRT Heritage Fund, ensuring support for CRT's future. Her careful review of monthly financial reports raised the standard for fiscal responsibility within the Guild.

For years, she chaired the Guild's 4th of July Committee, overseeing refreshment sales during the county's annual fireworks at the Pavilion. She's introduced countless fundraising ideas over the years—from summer ice cream sales to chocolate pizzas at Christmas.


These days, she's affectionately known as the Queen of the Cans. Martha spearheads the collection of returnable bottles and cans—both at the Pavilion in summer and downtown in winter—raising thousands of dollars through sheer persistence and effort. So when you're tossing your empties, remember: Martha is watching!

Martha's devotion to CRT is matched only by her broader commitment to the community. She's also active with the Girl Scouts, the 1890 House Museum, the Karen Sager Reading Group at the Homer Center for the Arts, and serves as president of the Homer literary club, *Sennightly*. Passionate about food rescue and fighting hunger, she's volunteered for over a decade serving summer lunches in the park through Catholic Charities and contributes to the work of the Seven Valleys Health Coalition and their Food Rescue and Giveaway Programs.


Martha is the kind of person every organization dreams of: hard-working, community-focused, outspoken in the best way, and deeply generous with her time and talents.

In Memory: Tom Knobel

On December 20, 2024, Cortland Repertory Theatre lost not just a long-time supporter, but a deeply valued member of our extended family: Tom Knobel.

Tom joined the CRT Board of Directors in 2008 and remained a dedicated, hands-on member until his final days—attending a November Budget and Finance meeting, and sharing laughter with his wife Cathy Bertini at our monthly Trivia Night.

During CRT's major Downtown renovation (2010-2015), Tom's support was nothing short of transformative. Beyond his generous

financial contributions, he was right there in the thick of it—picking up a hammer or broom during demolition and clean-up days. He brought energy, enthusiasm, and an eye for possibility, always imagining new ways the space could serve CRT's mission and future growth.

Throughout his tenure, Tom wore many hats: Vice President of the Board, key leader of the Capital Campaign Committee, and Chair of the Strategic Planning Committee. His insight, leadership, and commitment helped shape CRT's trajectory and ensured the long-term strength of both our downtown home and the Little York Pavilion.

His influence continues to echo throughout every corner of our organization.

Tom's impact reached far beyond CRT. He was a founding force behind the Center for the Arts of Homer, helping to secure the building, draft its foundational business plan, and guide its early success as both board member and financial advisor. He also served his community through the Rotary Club—as member and president—the Brockway Foundation as treasurer and trustee, and was a lifetime member of Lime Hollow Nature Center.

But above all. Tom was a friend.

He would often drop by the CRT office just to check in, share a thoughtful idea, or offer advice with a trademark mix of sharp wit and gentle encouragement. His warmth, wisdom, and dedication left a lasting impression on all who knew him.

Tom's legacy is etched into the heart of CRT and the greater arts community he helped build. We are forever grateful for his vision, his generosity, and his belief in the power of the arts to uplift and connect us all.

He will be deeply missed, but never forgotten.



Gloria became part of the CRT family in 2013 when she joined the Guild, and just two years later, she brought her enthusiasm and insight to the Board of Directors. Her thoughtful suggestions helped shape our policies and procedures, and her volunteer spirit was felt at every level of the organization.

But it was during the holiday season that Gloria truly shone. She took great joy in decorating for CRT's winter

events, earning the affectionate title "Queen of the Christmas Bows." Not only did she wrap decorative (empty) gift boxes to enhance the theatre's festive displays, but she also hand-crafted stunning, whimsical bows for the packages, that brought


cheer and charm to every corner of the space. Even in her later years, when energy was limited, she would smile and say, "As long as I can sit, I'll make bows."







He is an award-winning acting teacher and former head of the MFA acting program at Western Illinois University. The Illinois Theatre Association presented him with its Award of Excellence in College/University Theatre in 2020. Nicolás Guerrero (*Music Director*) is a music director, vocal coach, and collaborative pianist originally from Huntsville, AL. 
Michael Stewart (1924-1987) (Book) scored on Broadway the first time when he won a Tony Award for his Bye Bye Birdie libretto. He was the librettist for Carnival (Drama Critics Circle Award) and Hello, Dolly!, which earned him both a Tony and Drama Critics prize. Stewart also wrote the lyrics for Barnum and the book for: George M! (with Francine and John Pascal); Mack & Mabel; The Grand Tour and 42nd Street (with Mark Bramble); Harrigan and Hart; and I Love My Wife.

Jerry Herman (1931-2019) (Music & Lyrics) Hello, Dolly!, Mame, and La Cage Aux Folles are home to some of the most popular, most-often performed and most successful musical hero(in)es of all time, and have given Jerry Herman the distinction of being the only composer/lyricist in history to have had three musicals that ran more than 1,500 consecutive performances on Broadway. His first Broadway show was Milk and Honey (1961), followed by Hello, Dolly! (1964), Mame (1966), Dear World (1969), Mack & Mabel (1974), The Grand Tour (1979), La Cage Aux Folles (1983), Jerry's Girls (1985) and Mrs. Santa Claus (1996), a CBS TV special starring Angela Lansbury. Showtune, a revue of his life's work, has performed in regional theatres around the country and two of Jerry's classic songs are the emotional highlights of the hit Disney-Pixar film WALL-E. His string of awards and honors includes multiple Tony Awards, Grammys, Olivier Awards, Drama Desk Awards, the Johnny Mercer Award, the Richard Rodgers Award, the Oscar Hammerstein Award, the Frederick Loewe Award, the Songwriters Hall of Fame, the Theatre Hall of Fame and a Kennedy Center Honor.

Thornton Wilder (1897-1975), (*Author of The Matchmaker*) born in Madison, Wisconsin, and educated at Yale and Princeton, was an accomplished novelist and playwright whose works explore the connection between the commonplace and the cosmic dimensions of human experience. *The Bridge of San Luis Rey*, one of his seven novels, won the Pulitzer Prize in 1928, and his next-to-last novel, *The Eighth Day*, received the National Book Award (1968). Two of his four major plays garnered Pulitzer Prizes: *Our Town* (1938) and *The Skin of Our Teeth* (1943). His play *The Matchmaker* ran on Broadway for 486 performances (1955-1957), Mr. Wilder's Broadway record. Mr. Wilder also enjoyed enormous success with many other forms of the written and spoken word, among them translation, acting, opera librettos, lecturing, teaching and film (his screenplay for Alfred Hitchcock's 1943 psycho-thriller *Shadow of a Doubt* remains a classic to this day). Letter writing held a central place in Mr. Wilder's life, and since his death, three volumes of his letters have been published.

Mr. Wilder's many honors include the Gold Medal for Fiction from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, and the National Book Committee's Medal for Literature. On April 17, 1997, the centenary of his birth, the US Postal Service unveiled the Thornton Wilder 32-cent stamp in Hamden, Connecticut, his official address after 1930 and where he died on December 7, 1975.

Mr. Wilder continues to be read and performed around the world. *Our Town* is performed at least once each day somewhere in this country, with his other major dramas and shorter plays not far behind. In 2008, *Our Town* and *The Bridge of San Luis Rey* were selected as a joint choice for the NEA's "Big Read" Program. In recent years Wilder's works have also inspired a growing number of adaptations, among them an opera based on *Our Town* (music by Ned Rorem, libretto by J.D. McClatchy) and a dramatized version of his novel Theophilus North (Matt Burnett). Reflecting the renewed interest in Mr. Wilder, the Thornton Wilder Society sponsored the first international conference on his works in fall 2008. www.thorntonwilder.com.

Tanner Efinger (*Director*) is delighted to be back at CRT. A multi-hyphenate theatre artist living and working in Upstate NY, he recently directed productions at Cortland Repertory Theatre (*Wait Until Dark, The Emperor's New Clothes*), Syracuse Stage (*Salt City Drag Battle*), Le Moyne College (*The Trojan Women*), the Rochester Fringe and the Everson Museum of Art (*String Quartet Theatre*). Efinger is the Artistic Director of Breadcrumbs Productions, a small theatre company based in Syracuse and Rochester developing new theatrical experiences and supporting local artists.

Neil Simon (1927-2018) (*Playwright*) is widely regarded as one of the most successful, prolific and performed playwrights in theatre history. In addition to *Lost In Yonkers*, which won a Tony Award and Pulitzer Prize, his plays and musicals include *Come Blow Your Horn, Little Me, Barefoot in the Park, The Odd Couple, Sweet Charity, The Star-Spangled Girl, Plaza Suite, Promises, Promises, Last of the Red Hot Lovers, The Gingerbread Lady, The Prisoner of Second Avenue, The Sunshine Boys, The Good Doctor, God's Favorite, California Suite, Chapter Two, They're Playing Our Song, I Ought to be in Pictures, Fools, Brighton Beach Memoirs, Biloxi Blues, The Odd Couple* (female version), *Broadway Bound, Rumors, Jake's Women, The Goodbye Girl, Laughter on the 23rd Floor, London Suite, Proposals, Hotel Suite, The Dinner Party, 45 Seconds from Broadway, Oscar and Felix,* and Rose's Dilemma.

In addition to the film adaptations he wrote of many of his plays, his screenplay credits include After the Fox, The Out-Of-Towners, The Heartbreak Kid (original 1973 version), Murder by Death, The Cheap Detective, Seems Like Old Times, Only When I Laugh, Max Dugan Returns, The Slugger's Wife, The Marrying Man and The Odd Couple II. Other motion pictures based on stage plays include Come Blow Your Horn, Sweet Charity and The Star-Spangled Girl. For television, Mr. Simon wrote series, teleplays and motion pictures, including The Tallulah Bankhead Show, The Sid Caesar Show, The Phil Silvers Arrow Show, The Phil Silvers Show, The Garry Moore Show, The Trouble with People, ABC's Broadway Bound and Jake's Women.

Books by Neil Simon include Rewrites, A Memoir, The Play Goes On, four omnibus collections of Neil Simon's plays (The Comedy Of Neil Simon, The Collected Plays Of Neil Simon, Vol. 11, The Collected Plays Of Neil Simon, Vol. 3, The Collected Plays Of Neil Simon, Vol. 4) and Lost In Yonkers (screenplay).

Mr. Simon received more Academy and Tony nominations than any other writer. Awards he received include the Pulitzer Prize for Lost In Yonkers, Emmy Awards for The Sid Caesar Show and The Phil Silvers Show, Tony Awards for The Odd Couple, Biloxi Blues, Lost In Yonkers and a special Tony Award For Overall Contribution To The Theatre. His nominations include Tony Award Nominations for Little Me, Barefoot in the Park, Plaza Suite, Promises, Promises, The Last of the Red Hot Lovers, Brighton Beach Memoirs, Broadway Bound, Lost in Yonkers and The Goodbye Girl (musical). Other nominations include a Writers Guild Screen Award for The Odd Couple and The Out-Of-Towners, a Writers Guild Laurel Award, an American Comedy Award for Lifetime Achievement and a Writers Guild Screen Award Nomination for Barefoot in the Park, as well as an Oscar Nomination for The Odd Couple, an Evening Standard Award, a Sam S. Shubert Foundation Award, Kennedy Center Honors, a UCLA Medal, a Peggy V. Helmerich Distinguished Author Award and a William Inge Theater Festival Award for Distinguished Achievement in the American Theater.





Ashman's first love was theater. Ashman was a founder of off off Broadway's renowned WPA Theater, where he conceived, wrote and directed *God Bless You, Mr. Rosewater*, as well as the classic musical, *Little Shop of Horrors* (both music by Alan Menken). In 1986, he wrote and directed the Broadway musical *Smile* (music by Marvin Hamlisch). Lamented as a lost treasure of the 1980's theater scene, *Smile* remains popular on High School and College campuses throughout the country. Howard Ashman died in 1991 from complications of AIDS. Glenn Slater (Lyricist) co-created Disney's 2010 worldwide smash Tangled (2011 Grammy Winner, 2010 Oscar and Golden Globe nominee), as well as the Broadway and international hit musicals Sister Act (2011 Tony nominee - Best Score) and The Little Mermaid (2008 Tony nominee - Best Score, Grammy nominee - Best Cast Album), and, most recently School of Rock (2015). 
SCENIC DEPARTMENT

CRT proudly continues a long standing tradition in the 2024-25 school year with the Pavilion Awards!

The mission of this awards program is to celebrate and support the thriving and vibrant high school theatre community in the greater Cortland County area. CRT's intention is to bestow visibility and elevate the importance of theatre education in our schools and reward excellence onstage and off. CRT endeavors to be a vital resource for the theatrical communities in our school systems. We are stronger when we create community together.

Every musical, play or theatre festival produced in the current school year, and within the "Pavilion Community" (i.e., Cortland County, and schools just outside the county line which have attending students who live in Cortland County) are eligible. All awards are non-gender based, and all involved students, onstage or backstage, are eligible.

This year, these awards were presented at a gala held on Wednesday, May 14 at Cortland Repertory Theatre Downtown.

Shining Star Award

Each production was awarded "Shining Stars", chosen by the students involved in the production themselves. Students were asked to cast ballots for two individuals who proved to be enthusiastic, supportive, humble, and caring company members throughout the rehearsal and performance process.

Audience's Choice Award

Audience members were given the opportunity to vote for their two favorite students – onstage or backstage - from each production. Ballots were available and ballot boxes were placed in the lobby area.

Directors Champion Award

The directing team of each production chose up to two students who demonstrated exemplary leadership, compassion, maturity and an overall positive influence on the rehearsal and performance process.

The Rona Knobel Excellence in Theatre Education Award

This special recognition is awarded to one school each year. The recipient is a leading example of creativity, inclusion, and community outreach. Those productions interested in being considered submitted an application on their challenges, victories and learning experiences with this year's show. Each application was reviewed and carefully considered by the CRT committee with a final vote by secret ballot.


